The Dempster Highway stretches 740 kilometres to Inuvik; from there, the Inuvik to Tuktoyaktuk Highway continues over the pingo-studded tundra to the Arctic Ocean.



SOUTH NAHANNI RIVER

Framed by four towering canyons, the river spills through the alpine habitat of bears, Dall's sheep and moose. Those who travel the Nahanni are rewarded with visits to legendary landmarks, any of which are as awe-inspiring as the river itself.



KEELE RIVER

From the mouth of the Natla, the Keele slides through the fabled Mackenzie Range. The river is unbridged, untamed, rich in wildlife, and blissfully removed from the modern world. With a guide, the journey is suitable for all levels of canoeists.



THELON RIVER

The greatest of all Barrenland rivers rises just east of Great Slave Lake and flows through the Thelon Game Sanctuary - home to muskox, sandy dunes, and glacial eskers! Guided trips are offered with access by air from Yellowknife or Fort Smith.



HORTON RIVER

This river cuts through stunted spruce forest and Barrenland tundra to the Arctic coast.

Pass by the eerie Smoking Hills and impressive limestone canyons, guided by experts in wilderness expeditions.
